



Nottingham Works Programme: Step in to Work Plus

Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is the Nottingham Works Programme?

The Nottingham Works Programme consists of six related activities designed to help unemployed and economically inactive¹ young people in Nottingham to progress in education, training and employment opportunities.

The Nottingham Works Programme is part-financed by Nottingham City Council and the European Union through the European Social Fund and the Youth Employment Initiative Programme (YEI). ESIF supports activities to extend employment opportunities and develop a skilled workforce.

2. What is Step in to Work Plus?

The Step in to Work Plus Programme is one of the six activities in the City Council's Nottingham Works programme.

The **Step in to Work Plus Programme** is an extension of the existing Step into Work programme. It will provide additional community outreach for 18-29 year-olds, who are unemployed or economically inactive, to engage in mentoring, work readiness training and employment activity. The support is provided in the participants own community.

Eligible participants can access:

- A bespoke programme of support to help them overcome the barriers and develop the skills they need to secure employment.
- A hardship fund to contribute to IT, transport and childcare costs where these are creating barriers to their continuing participation in the programme.

3. Which young people are eligible?

Eligible participants must be:

- i. Nottingham City residents² aged between 18 and 29 year on the date they start the programme
- ii. Unemployed or economically inactive prior to starting the programme

¹ **Economically inactive** refers to a young person who is not seeking work or unavailable to start work

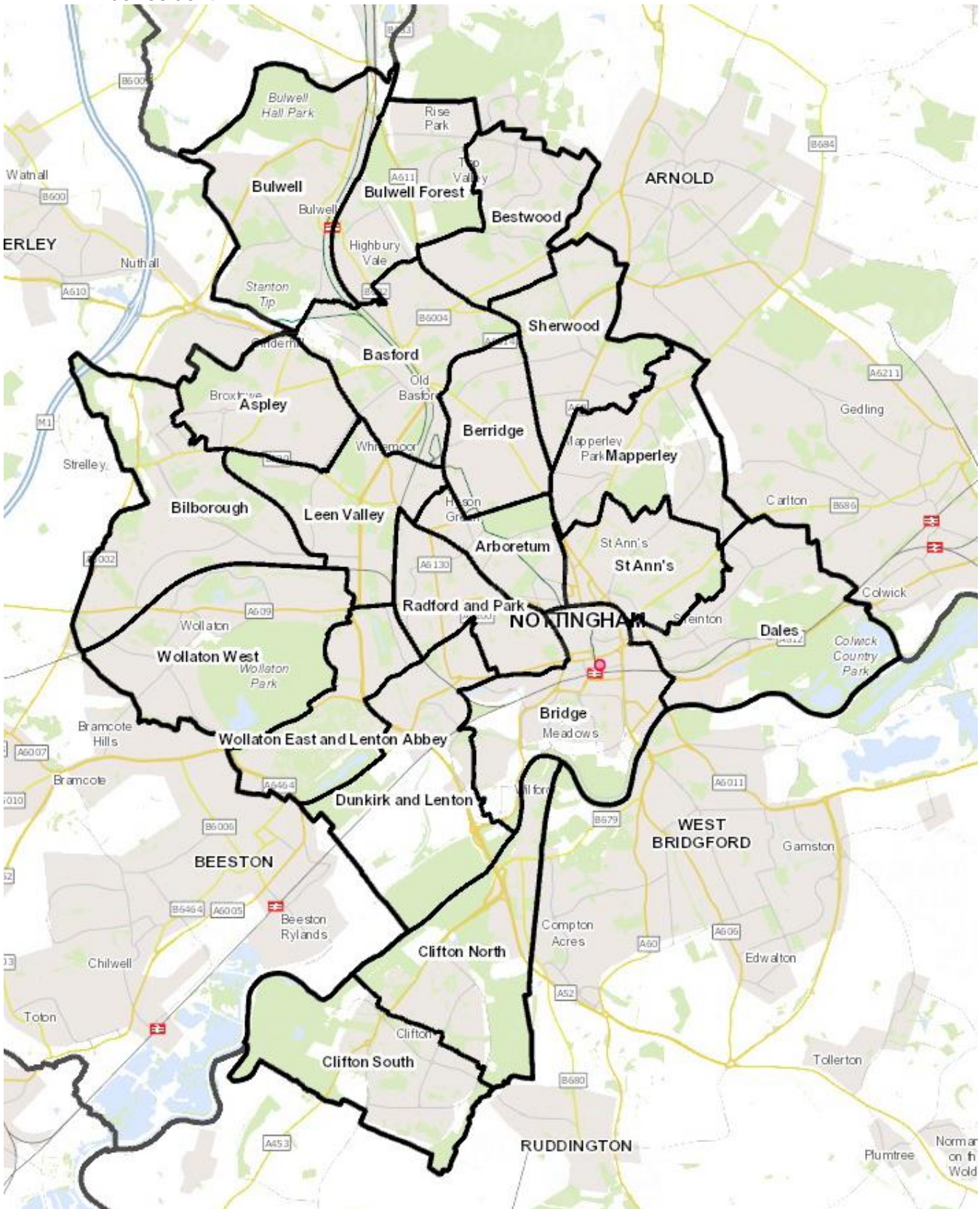
